Description: Work consists of furnishing all labor, transportation, machinery, tools means of transportation, supplies, equipment, materials, services, and incidentals necessary to achieve the following:
 Museum Park Baywalk (Phase II Base Bid): Includes the construction of a pedestrian walkway along the bulkhead which can be used for emergency access for fire trucks and other emergency vehicles. Walkway shall include associated site/civil, landscaping, irrigation and lighting work.
 Promenade (Phase III Add Alternate): Includes the construction of a pedestrian walkway along the northern boundary of the park, adjacent to the proposed Science and Art Museums, which can be used for special events, emergency access to fire trucks and other emergency vehicles. The work includes associated site/civil, landscaping, irrigation and lighting. In addition, an asphalt parking lot for approximately 40 cars will be constructed along with a restroom facility.

1.03 QUALITY ASSURANCE

- A. The CONTRACTOR'S Superintendent shall be well versed in Florida plant material, planting operations, blueprint reading, and coordination with other performing contracts or services in the job area. All CONTRACTOR employees shall be competent and highly skilled in their particular job in order to properly perform the work assigned to them. The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for maintaining the quality of the material on the job throughout the duration of its responsibility.
- B. Acceptance of any proposed individual, company, or corporation shall not relieve the Contractor of his responsibility to supervise the work and to coordinate the activities of his sub-contractor with work of all other trades.
 - 1. Sub-Contractor Qualification - No individual, company or corporation will be permitted to perform any work under this Section by Contract of sub-Contract unless such individual, company or corporation is fully qualified to perform the work. The Contractor, if requested, shall provide the following evidence that he or any of his proposed contractors or sub-contractors is qualified.
 - a. State or local license, where license is required by law.
 - b. Membership in trade or professional organizations;
 - 1. Associated Landscape Contractors of America;
 - 2. American Association of Nurserymen, or
 - 3. Florida Nurserymen and Growers Association.
 - c. List of three (3) similar projects which the individual, company or corporations performed under contract or subcontract to a general contractor or Owner.
- C. All plant material shall conform to the names given in Hortus Third, 1976 edition. Names of varieties not included therein conform generally with names accepted in the nursery trade.
- D. Correct Grade of Plants: Any supplier of materials misrepresenting the grade or quality of their materials (i.e. a higher grade than they are), as determined by the Landscape Architect through the application of the Plans and Specifications, shall not be allowed to supply any material for this project. All material already supplied and received from such a supplier, which is below specified grade, shall be removed and replaced at no additional cost to the City. This requirement for removal and replacement shall also include any installed materials. No further materials will be accepted from such supplier until written evidence is submitted and confirmed that all material for delivery is of the grade or quality represented.
