ADDENDUM NO. TWO

PURPOSE: The purpose of this Addendum/NOTICE is to make changes, additions, deletions, revisions, and clarifications to the (ITB) Invitation to Bid documents for **Stribling Way Landscape and Irrigation Improvements**. Bidder shall review the Addendum/NOTICE work and requirements in detail and incorporate any effects the Addendum/NOTICE may have in their proposal price.

1. What changes have been made to the plans?

Response: All of the shrubs have been removed from the plans in the area south of Stribling Way, except those shrubs, adjacent to the proposed irrigation pump, that are needed for screening. Instead of shrubs and mulch, the area will now consist of St. Augustine Floratam sod and mulch installed around the base of the proposed trees.

The 8" Reclaimed Main has been removed from the plans.

The layout of the irrigation main as it crosses the east-bound lanes of Stribling Way into the median has been revised so that the existing pavers will not need to be removed and replaced. Instead a longer bore on an angle will be required.

The fencing around the proposed irrigation pump will be furnished and installed by the Owner (Wellington).

Included with this addendum are revised plans and Schedule of Value.

2. Can a General Contractor bid this project if they use a landscaping firm that meets the requirements of Article 3.1?

Response: Yes, a General Contractor may bid this project, but must submit the name of the landscaping firm they will hire to perform all landscape installations. Along with the landscaping firm name, the Bidder must submit the names of key personnel of the landscaping firm that will work directly on this project along with proof of all required certifications and qualifications meeting the requirements of Article 3.1 (A) which reads as follows:

- A. Contractor must be a Florida Nurseryman, Growers and Landscape Association (FNGLA) Certified Landscape Contractor (FCLC) and shall have a minimum of five (5) consecutive year's experience in the installation of landscape materials. Key employees must have ISA Arborist Certification and/or FNGLA Horticultural Professional Certification (FCHP).
